Our next draw will be held May 15.

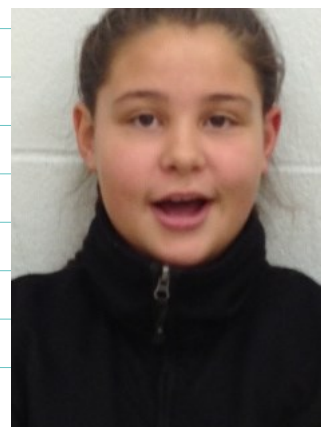
Congratulations to Jarryn for making the most sales in our latest fundraiser. As a thank you, he received a English Cottage Garden mix seed mat.
